“Natural contemplation, ‘theoria physike’, is an essential category in Orthodox spiritual terminology for the relationship of man with the environment. Natural contemplation is a stage in spiritual growth wherein the soul of a person has been cleansed of the effects of the passions and has returned to the natural state of human being, of human nature as it was created to be. Thus, a person who has purified himself and been illumined with grace will have a unique perspective on how to live in the created world, one informed by his enlightened perception. This perception in a state of natural contemplation is a transcendence of conceptual categories and their inherent dualism. It is, rather, a unitary experience of the synergy of all created beings with the Creator, of which one is a part rather than a subjective observer. Not only will the spiritually mature Christian have a profoundly different perspective and experience; he will seek to live according to that vision and draw others into it.

In other words, the whole creation comes to be perceived as a Mystery of God, a sacramental experience of communion. In the words of St. Isaac, “The world has become mingled with God, and creation and Creator have become one! Praise to You for Your inscrutable purpose: truly this mystery is vast” (II: V, §18, p. 14). The created world itself is sanctified and must be treated as something holy because it has been recapitulated in Jesus Christ (Eph. 1:10).”

Vatican Information Service recently stated Cardinal Leonardo Sandri, prefect of the Congregation for the Oriental Churches, addressed a letter to all bishops worldwide in view of the collection for the Holy Land.

“Presently, there are millions of refugees fleeing Syria and Iraq, where the roar of arms does not cease and the way of dialogue and concord seems to be completely lost. Senseless hatred seems to prevail instead, along with the helpless desperation of those who have lost everything and have been expelled from the land of their ancestors. If the Christians of the Holy Land are encouraged to resist, to the degree possible, the understandable temptation to flee, the faithful throughout the world are asked to take their plight to heart.”
