After Blessed is the Kingdom ... “*Christ is risen ...*” (3 times)

1. The Iconostasis Holy Doors remain open until the end of the Ascension Liturgy.
2. Services, such as Baptisms, Funerals, Memorials etc. celebrated between Monday, April 5, and Wednesday, May 12, start as follows: “*Blessed is our God...*” Then “*Christ is risen from the dead...*” (3 times).
